**Domestic full fee paying place**

The development of types of leadership and leadership issues from the perspective of teams is an essential component of health leadership preparing students for their role as leaders in their area. The program also enables health professionals to develop their knowledge and expertise to work effectively as clinical mentors, facilitators and preceptors in supporting the clinical education of students, peers and other health professionals with a particular, but not exclusive, focus on rural and non-urban settings.

### General

Enables health professionals to personalise the courses studied to suit their own specific needs by completing the core courses ([HEA8001](#), [HSC8050](#), [HSC8060](#), [HSC8070](#) and [HSC8080](#)) and six courses and one elective of their choice approved by the Program Coordinator to meet their professional learning objectives as well as overall program objectives. All course pre-requisites must be met, and all courses chosen are subject to the approval of the Program Coordinator.
